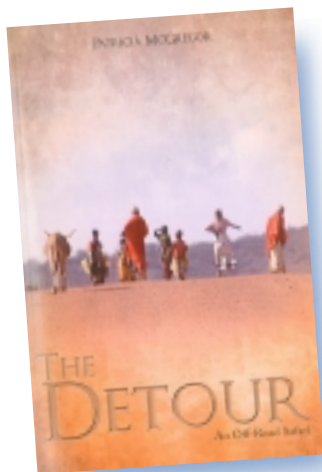

### SAMS Authors Publish African-Themed Books

This past year, two of our SAMS family published books set in Africa. Missionary Patsy McGregor, who serves with her husband Todd in the

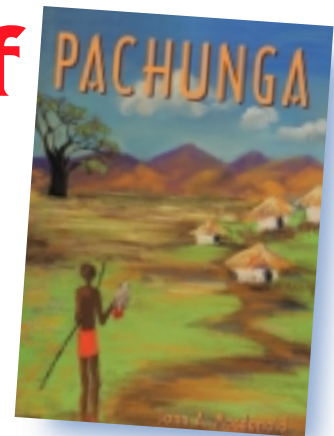
Diocese of Toliara, writes of a time when the political situation forced them to leave Madagascar for five years, finding work in Kenya. “The expected route, our route, is not always where God wants to take us,” she writes. “Rather, life may be a set of detours.” In *The Detour*, Patsy offers reflections from her own life and devotional insights for others who have found the highway of life barricaded and been forced to travel “off-road” for a time. In the excerpt below, she writes of a detour-within-a-detour, when, after a year of establishing herself as manager of St. Julian’s Centre for conferences and retreats near Nairobi, God called them to Marsabit, in Northern Kenya.

#### WAITING FOR THE CLOUD TO MOVE

The birds-eye view from the squeezed 6-seater Cessna confirmed the fact that we were on the edge of the Chelbi desert. Not a person nor animal was in sight. Not a bush to hide behind for natural relief nor a bird to hear chirp. Nothing. Absolutely nothing. My first thoughts? It looked like Mars...a...bit.

Todd wanted to show the girls and me the area where he

John’s book is a mid-grade fantasy novel, named for its central character, *Pachunga*, an aged warrior and tribal leader whose youth is restored when the Christ figure Olugbala calls upon him to gather an army to fight the evil Kjaz-Barbaroi and his Dark Creatures. In the excerpt below, the Chief has just regained consciousness after he and his friend and ally Kasuku, a talking parrot, were attacked by black kites and tawny eagles as their canoe headed for a waterfall known as “the Smoke that Thunders.” He, too, hears a call that requires faith to follow.

Where was that parrot? Could he have gone back to Olugbala to leave Pachunga to travel on alone? Of course not. Did that mean he had been killed by the raptors? Pachunga didn’t think so. Wherever he was, he was probably doing something important. Or maybe he had been taken prisoner. Perhaps he was in some kind of horrible danger. If so, Pachunga would have to find him to help him. But how?

*Pachunga!* The voice that called his name was soft. It was sweet. It could mysteriously be heard above the crashing of millions of tons of water. It was frightening, but not in a terrifying sort of way. It was a command.

It was the voice of Olugbala.

*Pachunga! Come to me, here!*

believed God was calling him... Marsabit is a mountain in the middle of the desert. Because of the cloud cover hovering over the mountain, we were unable to land and the pilot had to divert the flight to Shegel. We were delayed there for over an hour in the hot sun until the cloud cover dissipated and we could see the mountain...

While we waited for the cloud to move, it reminded me of how the Israelites in the desert depended upon God's guidance—waiting for the cloud to move. They lingered, hanging around for God to give them guidance on when to continue the journey.

Discernment of God's will can be like a thick cloud on a cool morning. Sometimes it is difficult to see the hand in front of us. Sometimes we barely feel His touch. Missionaries are not always without doubt and fears of their own. One day, I had a hard time expressing my thoughts in journal form, so I wrote a poem...

## SAFE IN HIS ARMS

I am scared, Lord  
Scared of being uncomfortable  
Scared of not having my own needs met  
Scared of bandits  
Scared, just scared, of the unknown

This is where I come  
To gain peace within the storm  
I trust these people  
Therefore, I refuse to wipe my tears away

Because it's here that I come  
To be open with others and myself  
To be free to laugh and free to cry  
To lift my journey like a sacrifice of praise  
As the incense fills the room so our prayers are placed at his feet  
Spoken and unspoken requests before the Lord  
All are known by Him  
In His Hands we find shelter  
We are safe in his arms

I was struggling with this detour in life. Comfortable, beautiful St. Julian's Centre was a blessing for me. It was not only a place where I used my spiritual gifts, but I found out who I was—my identity—as a person, and my place in this world. Why would we want to leave it and go to the desert—back into the wilderness? Why would I want to leave the safe shelter and be vulnerable once again? Truly, I was having to consider the cost of leaving St. Julian's and go to Marsabit. ■

"Is that y-you, Olugbala?" He knew that it was, though he found that he had to ask anyways. The Drum beat faintly, filling Pachunga's head with doubts as to whether the voice really came from Olugbala or whether he should obey what it was telling him to do.

Pachunga took a step. All his reasoning told him not to do it. The Drum beat louder. Perhaps it wasn't Olugbala at all. Perhaps it was Kjaz-Barbaroi leading him to his death.

*Boom!* went the drum.

He was afraid of dying.

*Boom! Boom!* It wasn't time yet. He had just been made young again.

*Boom! Boom! Boom!*

But he couldn't stay on the ledge forever. And Olugbala would never lead him to his death in this way. The Drum began to weaken. He had to make a move. Right now Olugbala was calling him. He had to obey. The Drum stopped.

"By your blessed name!" he exclaimed, taking a step forward right into the falling water. It splashed over him lightly, drenching him.

To his amazement, he wasn't swept to his death. Instead, he discovered that he was standing in the mouth of a cave behind the falling water. Olugbala could not be seen. But that didn't matter very much. He had come to where Olugbala wanted him to be. ■
