I am spending less time in Honduras due to circumstances beyond my control. My son, John, has been diagnosed with Stage IV colon cancer, and I am spending time in Texas to be with him and help him.

As a result I am spending more time in the air, and more money on the airlines than I would like to, as I shuttle back and forth.

He is responding well to chemo and radiation, and as many of you are already praying for him, I think we may see the miracle we hope for. Recently the VA changed his treatment to Texas Oncology, where they can do chemo and radiation at the same time. It's a God thing that we have been praying for. The VA has been wonderful. I can't say enough good things about them.

I took off for three weeks to make a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela in Spain with my sister. It was a very inspirational and much-needed break. Santiago is St. James, the apostle who evangelized in Spain. His body was returned there for burial. We also went to the Basilica of Fatima in Portugal, which was amazing. We planned it six months ago before I knew about John's diagnosis, but it worked out fine.

I am currently in Honduras, where work is going forward on the kindergarten in San Lorenzo. I have had to let go and let God on my projects. Not surprisingly, they are moving forward better than ever.
