

The Rt. Rev. Abraham Yel Nhial, a bishop in South Sudan, is joining SAMS. In 1989 he met Christ in Ethiopia as a refugee who had fled his devastated Sudanese village. He was one of 20,000 orphans known as the "Lost Boys of Sudan." Forced to flee again while clutching his new Bible, Abraham ended up in a Kenyan refugee camp. At the camp he met his future wife, Daruka, and was selected to resettle in the United States. Abraham caught the attention of CBS' 60 Minutes correspondents when they saw his insight: "I am called a lost boy, but I am not lost from God." Today, Abraham is back in South Sudan as bishop of the Diocese of Aweil.



Here's a brief excerpt of my conversation with him when he was at the SAMS office in February:



Bishop Abraham Yel Nhial

What challenges do the South Sudanese people face?

The biggest struggle is trauma. These people have been in a war for many, many years — so they have been traumatized. They need peace, reconciliation, and counseling.

What pleasures do you experience in your ministry?

I enjoy that [our diocese] runs six primary schools and one high school. At our Bible school, we train students in ministry leadership, counseling, and peacebuilding.

It is interesting that the students at your Bible school study peacebuilding.

We know that we don't have a true peace in this sinful world. We will have a true peace when Christ returns, when we are in Christ, in eternity. Still on this earth, when there are a lot of conflicts, the church needs to be continually cultivating peace.

What have you learned about peace?

To have peace, it is something to do with compromise. You may have a right, but for the sake of peace you have to compromise. And the Bible taught us to do that; we have to forgive one another. Peter asked Jesus: how many times should I do that? And the answer Jesus gave to him was: you don't need to count. [You do not say,] I forgave you the other day, the other time, the other year, and that year — No. It becomes part of our life as Christians to continue forgiving ...

And have mercy. Have mercy. Have mercy.

God Provides through SAMS World Relief Fund



Globally, SAMS Missionaries have experienced the impact of COVID-19 in a variety of ways.



Some missionaries have lost friends suddenly on the mission field due to the disease.



Ministry to people's souls and emotions has intensified.



Many see their communities struggling to get food and income in the midst of pandemic lockdowns.

God has called many missionaries to help their communities in practical ways. SAMS' fourth core value is "serving incarnationally with integrity and compassion for the needs of others." To this end, the SAMS Board of Trustees in April approved a plan to provide grants to

missionaries and dioceses through the SAMS World Relief Fund (SAMS WRF). To encourage others and kickstart the effort, the board doubled the existing balance of SAMS WRF through a transfer from SAMS Great Commission Fund. In the first round alone, SAMS WRF provided 15 grants for a total of \$37,200 to meet the practical needs of people in missionaries' communities and dioceses. As of July, \$23K will be given for a second round of grants. The generosity of Senders giving directly to special ministry projects (an additional \$20K+) and to SAMS WRF is providing food, medical supplies, local jobs, and hope. Missionaries and their Senders are sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ through the witness of the global church serving communities in need.



Maize Distribution in Uganda: Missionary Janine LeGrand is working with the Diocese of Masindi to give out bags of maize to the community. The Diocese gave away 4.7 tons in the first days through funds they raised locally.



Community Outreach in Mexico: In June, Missionary Meredith's church distributed food, supplies, and Bible activities for kids to 122 families. Many recipients passed on supplies to others in need, thereby extending the reach of the church.



Prayer Bench Job Creation in Madagascar: Missionary Jacky Lowe is coordinating construction of prayer benches for St. Patrick's Cathedral in Toliara. Purchase of supplies and labor benefits local workers.

December 1-7: AFRICA: Southern Africa

Pray with **Johann and Louise Vanderbijl** as the Christian community in Villiersdorp, South Africa, works together to provide meals for thousands of vulnerable children. Ask God to grant the Vanderbijls good health, and that God would work through their church and educational ministries.

Lift up **April Sylvester** as she ministers in Jesus' name in Ndola, Zambia. People's needs for mental health support have doubled in the wake of the pandemic. Pray for April's project to provide resources for free clinical therapy to Zambians. May the participants find hope and freedom.

December 8–14: AFRICA: South Sudan and Ethiopia

Pray for **Abraham, Daruka, Naomi, Mary, David, Emmanuel, Martha, and Anna Nhial** as Abraham ministers as Bishop of the Diocese of Aweil in South Sudan.
