Roxana's Story

Meredith Omland is a SAMS Missionary in Mexico who recently shared this personal testimony from a young woman in her parish. Roxana's story is a testament to God's transforming power despite tragedy and suffering, as well as to the faithful day-to-day ministry of SAMS Missionaries serving God's people in the Church.


y name is Roxana and I grew up in a community outside of Fresnillo, Mexico. On August 25, 2007, when I was nine years old, my family and I were in a car accident. The man who crashed his truck into our vehicle was drunk and high, and his driving was out of control. My dad was killed and that was the hardest thing that has ever happened in my life. After the accident, my mom was in the ICU for a week



and both of my brothers were also treated for broken bones. I also had a fractured femur, a head injury, and a fractured spinal column, leaving me paralyzed from the waist down. I don't remember much of what happened during those days and weeks after the accident, but we ended up going to live with my maternal grandmother, right down the street from the church where I now attend.

In those years that followed the

accident, everything seemed dark and I didn't have any hope of a promising future. My disability held me back and I was full of anger and bitterness. I didn't know to ask for help to deal with all my negative emotions. I thought my anger and bitterness was normal for someone in my situation and I didn't think I had any other option but to live feeling that way for the rest of my life. When I became aware of what was going on inside of me, I was 14 years old.



I started attending church in hopes of receiving an academic scholarship. I began to learn about God, about what He had done for me and about His great love. It took a while, but eventually I was able to overcome all those negative emotions that were controlling me. I was able

to share with my mom and help her feel better and know God's love for her as well. I continued going to school and preparing for the future because I wanted to be a better person.

One evening, at a special prayer time at church, God touched me and I was finally able to forgive the driver of the vehicle that killed my father and left me in a wheelchair. I was able to truly love God and know that His love for me is greater than everything else.

I know that at the beginning I started attending church because I wanted to be awarded a scholarship, but then everything changed when I came to truly know the Lord. I know that God used all of this in my life to prepare me for what He had planned for me, to be a children's Sunday School teacher, to read Scripture in church on Sundays, to be someone who shares God's Word with those who need to hear it, to help those around me, to be one who helps prepare various details for Sunday's worship service, to be one who prays for others, and above all, to know that God is with me always, even in the hard times. *continued on page 7*

The Pellonis: Equipping in Cambodia



he Cambodian Church is complex and communal," Anthony Pelloni told me recently. "And because Cambodian culture is already communal, Anglicanism's communal life and worship is a good fit for them." Anthony and his wife, Anna, have served in Cambodia for over eight years, but now as SAMS Missionary Candidates they are in the process of returning with a more focused call. "The Lord has clearly given us hearts for the Cambodian people, but now with an emphasis on equipping." The Pelloni's have been very involved with the Anglican Church in Phnom Penh and that will continue but now the emphasis is on engaging new believers. "We will be part of the team launching a new church on the north side of the city. Young Cambodian students flock to the city to study and so we will be focusing on doing dorm ministry. Alongside two Anglican priests, we will be starting with a group of 60-70 people." While the Cambodian church already has many believers, Anthony says that they are often not well equipped to share the gospel. "We see our role as discipling these Cambodian believers and giving them the knowledge and the tools to evangelize and disciple other new Cambodian believers." The Pellonis will also have a role to play in bringing together the Khmer and English-speaking Anglican congregations who,

The Gressers: Equipping in Malawi

he Anglican Church in Malawi, part of the Province of Central Africa, is growing and with that comes even greater need to train the next generation of priests and laypeople to lead the Church. The Lord has prepared Bob and Traci Gresser to help meet this challenge, and has given them the vision to make an immediate impact through theological instruction at the Leonard Kamungu Theological College in Zomba, Malawi.

In addition to teaching, Fr. Bob will be helping the college seek accreditation, offering a bachelor's degree as well as a distance learning program. This will eliminate the need for those seeking ordination to leave the country. The goal is to graduate 10-12 students per year, each of which will have pastoral oversight of approximately 400 people. Fr. Bob's teaching of traditional biblical Anglicanism will make an immediate impact, especially for the Anglican Church in Malawi that stands at a crossroads.



though they are part of one church, speak two of the three predominant languages there – Khmer, Mandarin or English. The Pellonis hope to help raise up a new generation of young Cambodians who know and serve Jesus and want new believers to do the same.

Note: The Pellonis have been busy this year speaking to churches and individuals and have raised 52% of their fundraising goal, but they still need Senders who can make a monthly commitment so that they can return to Gospel ministry in Cambodia this Fall.

The Gressers plan to move to Malawi in October. They have received support from enough Senders for outgoing expenses and 2 years of service due in part to generous one-time donors. They are still seeking a few more monthly Senders to walk in partnership with them past the 2-year mark. Please keep them in your prayers.

October 22-October 31: ASIA: Cambodia

Those of you who have sponsored my scholarship and who have prayed for me over the past eight years are an example to me, an example of loving your neighbor. You helped me even when you hardly knew me, without knowing if I would be responsible with my scholarship or not. I give thanks to God each day, for all that my church family has given me (and you are a part of that family!), and for all those who have made all of this possible.

I continue to pray that future generations will also be able to receive scholarships and make the most of the opportunity. I also pray for you, who are great examples of sharing God's love with others. I hope that one day I will be able to be a light for someone as you have been for me. Now the college graduate, the children's Sunday School teacher, the one who works part time for the church, but most of all Roxana, who now knows that God loves her, would hug the 14-year-old Roxana who could hardly breathe to let her know that her future was not dark and hopeless.
