Faithful Perseverance in the Lord over Decades



C.S. Lewis once said, "God knows our situation; He will not judge us as if we had no difficulties to overcome. What matters is the sincerity and perseverance of our will to overcome them."

f that is what matters, then Andrew Osmun's perseverance has resulted in a longer tenure of service to SAMS than anyone. His roles have been many – short-term missionary, prayer warrior, sender of multiple missionaries, long-time Board member, and many others – adding up to over 47 years of active involvement. So, it's easy to assume that cross-cultural mission has always run through his veins, but by his own admission, the journey into mission started quite inauspiciously over tea and biscuits.

During an invitation to join a prayer tea with other Wycliffe Hall students, Andrew found himself praying for missionaries from a missionary society called SAMS, of which he had never heard.

Shortly thereafter, Andrew was hired as an assistant to serve with Rick Lobs, an early SAMS founder, at the parish in McKeesport, Pennsylvania. Andrew's heart for mission was quite evident and Rick invited him to serve on the SAMS-USA Board that had just formed in 1976.



Andrew recalls, "Mission was something I believed in, but was not evident in the Episcopal Church at the time, and I thought to myself, 'what's better than helping to begin a Society that would actually raise up and send missionaries?'"

"The thinking at the time among evangelicals was that you needed to establish a seminary and then establish a mission



society so that those who had an evangelical faith would in fact be able to be placed in situations where they could demonstrate it. The work early on was challenging in just getting the Society established and functioning with people qualified to lead it. We had no precedent on which to base a Society," says Andrew.

Other challenges emerged including overcoming significant initial debt, identifying bishops to receive SAMS missionaries, finding generous Senders, and encouraging people to discern a call to serve as missionaries. Andrew was instrumental in placing the early missionaries in situations where they could be fruitful and with bishops who would support them well, despite financial limitations.

"In those early years when we were in debt," said Andrew, "I suggested that we as a Board pray and fast weekly for a year so that God would provide the resources we needed. And we clearly began to see God at work through the generosity of key individuals and a large incoming class of missionaries who gave us a healthy footing. God blessed us in profound ways."

In addition to following the Anglican model of working in partnership with Anglican churches overseas, Andrew says that "the sensibilities were for a Society that treated its missionary personnel with love, respect, care, and support from the get-go. These essential principles are enshrined in how we even today identify, assess, train, send, and support missionaries and their families." continued on page 7

Cate Waddell: Fully Living into God's Call in Honduras



n college, Cate Waddell knew that she wanted to go to other countries. She also knew that she loved the Spanish language and teaching, both of which she had studied at North Carolina State. It wasn't long before the Lord opened a week-long opportunity through her aunt and uncle to serve children in Honduras at LAMB Institute, which nurtures and educates children at risk. "The kids impacted me. I just felt it," said Cate. "The kids

had these difficult childhood situations, but their love for God and each other was just amazing."

Later, a three-month opportunity to teach in Peru opened up. "I loved the teaching and being immersed in Spanish-language culture, but something was missing, just that connection." It was through that experience that God began giving her a focal point in which to steward her gifts and energy toward returning to LAMB to teach a bilingual class of first-grade children at God's Little Lambs School. "The value of education in a country like Honduras is not just for learning's sake, but it is helping families value education as well."

Through her year-long teaching ministry as a SAMS Bridger in 2023, God confirmed her call. After walking through a discernment process with SAMS, Cate is now a full-time Missionary back in Tegucigalpa, Honduras. As she teaches, Cate also looks forward to helping with the launch of the Joy Christian Academy, which will help expand Gospel ministry to more children!

Making Disciples goes Full-time

ucy Chaves was born in Kenya, and after marrying, she and her husband David served as SAMS

Missionaries in Nairobi. As their family grew, they felt led to relocate in the U.S., but continued as Associate Missionaries with SAMS through Kenya Connection, a ministry they started.

Working closely with partners across Kenya, David and Lucy empower Kenyan youth and young adults through education, mentorship, and business development. Lucy says, "The center of everything we do is about discipling young people to know and serve Christ with an eye towards making disciples who make disciples."

The Nairobi-based team sponsors scholarships for schoolchildren and has training programs at schools in Kilifi and Nairobi. There is also a program training youth in their media business, focusing on creating content with an emphasis on portraying the stories of the Gospel through changed lives. The primary ministry, however, continues to be reaching high school and college-aged students with the life-giving message of Jesus Christ.



Due to growth of the ministry, Lucy feels led to expand her role. "We recognized the strategic need to build capacity, refine processes, and equip our team. It was time for me to say 'yes' to what I saw the Lord doing." Consequently, Lucy is returning to being a full-time Missionary with SAMS. Reflecting on their 16 years with SAMS in various roles, Lucy says, "God has been faithful to us, so we wanted to be preparing our people well as we lean on God and his faithfulness to us."

If you ask Andrew, he can tell you story after story from his work in the field with SAMS Missionaries over the years. Yet, in the face of the attractiveness and draw to doing the actual mission work himself, Andrew says, "over time I learned that there was a role for those who stay and send, in addition to those who go. It became clear to me that, by grace, that was to be my role; to stay and serve on the Board but to also be an active Sender of missionaries. The staff and Board were very supportive and even though it was painful for me, I persevered."

Cultivating and nourishing relationships with others lies at the center of Gospel work wherever it may be, and for Andrew, the relationships have meant everything to him. He is still actively involved in support of two missionary families and a regular encourager of the home staff.

"To be a good listener and to understand what goes on with missionaries at the different stages of their work abroad has allowed me to pray with intelligence, to listen with intelligence, and to help patiently nourish what has grown to be a significant community. It's not rigid. I liken SAMS to a family, in the best sense of the word, to a place of real belonging, a place with a sense of wanting to hear stories and tell stories, but especially of wanting to tell the greatest story that could ever be told."
