Weeldreyers Serving on Two Fronts in Rwanda

astors are the backbone of the global church, and the churches they serve in the Global South are growing the fastest. With this growth comes the obvious need for discipleship, yet only 20% of these Global South pastors have received some level of theological training.

SAMS Missionary Wade Weeldreyer is acutely aware of this challenge. He has been teaching pastors in Kigali, Rwanda, for the last two years. He teaches Hebrew and systematic theology in the Department of Religion at East African Christian College (EACC).


"Our own statistics confirm that over 80% of the clergy in the Anglican Church of Rwanda have only the equivalent of an elementary education," says Wade. "This becomes a significant challenge in the context of the growing church here, experiencing growth that is a mile wide, but only an inch deep. The Anglican Church here has responded to that need, prompted as well by a 2018 Rwandan law outlining theological training for clergy."

For Wade, seeds were planted at the age of 12 when he began earnestly reading the Bible for himself. By the time he reached high school, he was leading a study for his school, opening students' eyes to the Scriptures and helping them connect the Gospel to their own questions. That drove him to pursue biblical studies and languages in college and seminary.

During college, Wade spent time abroad studying at Jerusalem University College (JUC). That is where he met Chelsea, who was working for the JUC at the time, and shared his passion for language, biblical studies, and living in a cross-cultural context.

"It snowed four inches in Jerusalem when we were there. A group of us wanted to walk to the Mount of Olives to look out over the Judean wilderness at sunrise the next morning. But when morning arrived, it was just Chelsea and I. That was the start of it," says Wade.





And if you ask Wade, it was meeting and eventually marrying Chelsea during seminary, (along with her consistent encouragement to consider serving in the mission field together) that opened him up to the possibility of taking this step in mission.

"I am grateful for the role I have in training pastors. There is such an ongoing need for well-equipped pastors and I love the relationships I am building with them," says Wade. "As overall education rises in Africa, theological education must rise with it. Bad theology is an issue here as in other parts of the world, but especially the prosperity gospel. My students in the classroom recognize it as an issue along with other kinds of false teaching."

"The other dynamic is that both laypeople and pastors are eager to learn. They want to study and know more. And even though they are under-resourced, they have pressing questions in the classroom that they want to discuss, so I facilitate these discussions. They are learning to become more of a reading culture. When you do put books in their hands, they still have to learn the discipline of reading and thinking critically."

Chelsea's developing faith propelled her early on to pursue mission, but she didn't have examples of women leading in robust, meaningful roles except for women missionaries. "I think God really used that because it opened up the category of 'missionary' for me," recalls Chelsea. "Once we were in Rwanda the Lord directed me to a ministry I had known previously. A professor in college had recognized in me a desire to help underprivileged

students coming from the Global South, particularly Africa and Asia. While David focuses on teaching, Mary Beth is looking forward to ministering with their three young children in the community, especially through her gifts in music. Their family's vision is to train and equip leaders for ministry in the global church, particularly in marginalized regions.

Secondly, they seek to be faithful, compelling Christian witnesses in Western Europe, a region wrestling with fundamental questions in the wake of the scourge of secularism. Their family will join in ministry with four SAMS Collaborative Missionaries already serving at Tyndale (primarily sent through SAMS mission sending partners in Australia and Canada) and four SAMS Missionaries serving nearby. As they seek additional Senders in the coming year, David will be finishing his Ph.D. They are overjoyed that God has led them on this path from the USA to Belize to Canada and now to the Netherlands.

Omars to serve at Holy Cross Cathedral in Georgia for Refugee outreach

an and Cesiah Omar will be sharing the good news of the Gospel with refugees and other immigrants in the region of Clarkston, Georgia. Known as the "the most diverse square mile in America" and "the Ellis Island of the South," this small town has been identified by refugee resettlement programs as a good fit for displaced persons coming from war-torn or otherwise unstable regions around the world. Dan and Cesiah will serve as SAMS Missionaries-in-Residence at Holy Cross Cathedral, Loganville, Georgia, in the Anglican Diocese of the South, coming alongside and seeking to grow the ministry team already working with refugees. This call is an answer to prayer and seems to fit the unique ways in which God has formed Dan and Cesiah.

Dan grew up in a multi-ethnic and multi-faith region of northern Kenya, his father having converted to Christianity from Islam as a young man. Dan has also experienced diverse cultures as he pursued training for ministry in Uganda and the U.S. Cesiah has also experienced many cultures through her parents Stewart and Laura Wicker, who are serving with SAMS, as well as in cross-cultural



missions and work experience with students from other countries. Cesiah is caring for their daughter Lily and is discerning how she might best minister among internationals in their new community. As Dan and Cesiah raise up Senders to join in this call of evangelism and outreach among those at our doorstep, they will be mentored by Daniel and Rebekah Behrens, SAMS Missionaries-in-Residence, engaged in refugee ministry in Pittsburgh.

people and those facing challenges with poverty, and recommended I connect with an organization called Word Made Flesh, which serves those in poverty through sustainable development. They are highly relational, viewing a person struggling with poverty holistically, ministering to their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs, without downplaying any of them."

Chelsea arrived at a key time for the Word Made Flesh team. and she sees her work as both meaningful and humbling. "I don't do a lot of the direct ministry. My role is staff support and communications." The staff needs time to disengage and rest. She coordinates and leads their staff retreats so they can rest and recharge, and Chelsea sees the trickle-down effect from the staff to the people they serve. She also produces the newsletter and handles other communications needs for the organization.

Wade sums up their experience having now been in Rwanda for two years. "Growing up in the U.S. we were taught to value productivity, efficiency, and selfresponsibility. As a missionary, in a sense, you become a child again. You lose a sense of selfsufficiency because that's not valued here. What is valued here in Rwanda is personal presence through relationships; that's what we're learning. It's like a mirror reflecting back what God wants us to learn. It poses the question to us of what really matters in this world."
