Missionary Internships: Bridging Cultures to Share the Love of Jesus

Opportunities abound in Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania, and the Americas

The opportunity for various kinds of missionary service has expanded dramatically, and the Anglican Church is no exception. Over the years, SAMS has found that many feel called to cross-cultural missionary service, or at least explore it, who desire to do more than a short-term mission but are not ready or able to commit to career service. For this reason, in 2005 SAMS inaugurated what has become the Bridger Ministry, a mentored internship with career missionaries for a month to a year in Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania, or the Americas.

The Bridger Ministry opens a way for Anglicans of all ages to ‘bridge’ cultures (hence, the name) through experiential ministry alongside a seasoned missionary and, in many placements, offers the opportunity to live with a host family. Importantly, the sending church ‘bridges’ to the host church in which the Bridger ministers, enriching and expanding the Kingdom impact.

“God calls Christians into service in various seasons and life stages—pre-career, mid-career, and post-career,” says Lucy Chaves, SAMS Bridger Ministry Coordinator. “We have had Missionary Bridgers in ages ranging from 18 to 88. However, we find that the reason people serve as Bridgers has less to do with their age or life stage and much more to do with faithfully responding to the desire the Holy Spirit has nurtured within them to serve others for the

sake of the Gospel. Typically, God has given them experience, a specific skill set, or even a burden which has prompted them to pursue their calling in a way that active missionary service can begin to fulfill.”

Serving cross-culturally as a Missionary Bridger intern has the added spiritual benefit of discernment. If a Christian who knows they want to serve begins to explore in greater depth what missionary service looks like day-to-day in a very specific cultural context, that process allows an element of refinement as God leads and directs. If discernment can take place in parallel with the actual exercise of ministry, then a confirmation of call towards or away from similar ministry is that much more pronounced. Lucy adds, “Discernment is not meant to be a solo project. Discernment can and should occur with those serving alongside you. That’s a big reason why our Missionary Bridgers are partnered with and mentored by an experienced long-term SAMS Missionary who walks alongside the Bridger.”

In addition to leading the coordination of the Bridger Ministry, Lucy herself is a full-time SAMS Missionary.

She is based in the U.S. but leads a very active youth discipleship ministry in Kenya, operating in different parts of the country. She has unique insights on missionary service cross-culturally. “Bridgers actually learn how to speak in people’s heart language. You live with people where they live. And the longer you do that and the better you become at learning their heart language the more you begin to appreciate people within their own cultural context. Culture is a good teacher, and the better you understand it the better equipped you’ll be to minister to people more effectively.

The insights you gain are a real blessing. Once you come to better understand people in their own context, you begin to see things from their point of view, and it not only enriches your own life as a Bridger, but it humbles you, enabling you to develop deep and lasting friendships of love and understanding. After all, isn’t that what our Lord wants us to do?”
