Missionaries Walking in SAMS Global Vision

The first rays of the Tulear sun reveal small groups cooking breakfast over charcoal and wood. Children carry water in jerrycans as young men wash their faces and women begin to sing. Hundreds roll up blankets from their short night's sleep on the sandy soil. They sit in groups sharing rice porridge, laughter, and worship songs. Some have walked as many as forty miles to be here. They've come to witness the consecration of a new assistant bishop, a man who led many of them to faith. . .

Seventeen years earlier a young Kenyan left his homeland at the invitation of the bishop of the embryonic Diocese of Toliara, Madagascar. It was a bold invite: Come to the poorest region of one of the poorest countries in the world, learn the language, and work alongside the Malagasy to share Christ, plant churches, and train evangelists.

Victor was one of the first long-term missionaries sent out by the Anglican Church of Kenya. Once in Madagascar, he took the approach of a learner, seeking to soak up Malagasy culture and forge friendships. He became fluent in the local language and adapted local customs while sharing Christ with almost everyone he met. He flourished in Madagascar.

Victor's support team from his home church in Kibera met regularly to pray. Some of the members gave up meals each

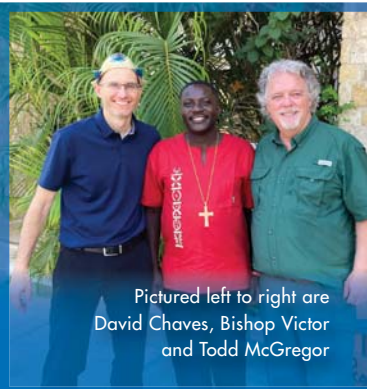

week to send money to support their missionary friend. In their sacrifices, both small and large, there was a sense of divine calling. Even though the church and most of its members resided in Africa's largest slum, they were playing a pivotal role in God's global mission - sending a missionary to take the gospel to another nation.

Victor's ministry blossomed: training new evangelists, coordinating outreach programs, providing pastoral oversight for growing churches, and more. Along the way, Victor met his future wife. Nolavy, the daughter of a local shaman, had put her trust in Christ, and she, too, had sensed a call to ministry. During their engagement, she traded places with Victor, traveling to Kenya for theological education, returning to serve alongside him, currently as the Diocesan Women's Center Coordinator. Today, Victor and Nolavy have four children, and the Diocese of Toliara has over seventy new churches, a vibrant theological college, and a strong women's ministry.

The Defiant Joy of Sudan's Nuba People

"But rejoice inasmuch as you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed."

— 1 Peter 4:13

Peter's call to endure and even rejoice defies our every instinct. How can anyone rejoice in the midst of suffering, especially the kind of suffering we see in places like Sudan?

For years, tribal suppression has posed a threat in places like the Nuba Mountains, especially among believers in Jesus Christ. Indigenous groups have long faced unrest, whether from Islamic sultanates, the slave trade, or nation formation amid coups and civil wars. Throughout all this, a diversity of tribes has held fast in the Nuba Mountains, united by a culture of defiance.

When South Sudan became an independent country in 2011, many contested regions were left behind. Violence ensued, and southern sympathizers were targeted. The Nuba tribes resisted attacks and faced bombing raids for over a decade. Many suffered deeply; others fled the country.

Amid this suffering, the Church made a new name for itself. Instead of abandoning the people, Christians built hospitals and schools, preaching encouragement even with bombers swarming overhead. In 2005, the Anglican Church in the Nuba Mountains consisted of only five churches and a few thousand members. Today, there are well over 100 churches and 60,000 Anglicans.

In 2011, as attacks on the Nuba Mountains increased, Bishop Andudu Adam Elnail found himself as an asylee in Harrisonburg, Virginia, where he received medical care and pursued further education. Instead of staying put in his new American home, Bishop Andudu spent much of his time going back and forth to support his diocese. He explains his vision in these words:

"Last time, we let the war keep us from developing. We felt like we had to wait, do nothing, and just endure. This did not work and we lost an entire generation to the war. Not again! We will not wait for the war to stop. Will it ever stop? The church has work to do."

As Anglicans in Virginia got to know Bishop Andudu, they were inspired by the defiance and determination he possessed in joyfully and sacrificially caring for his flock. Out of this, Sudan Church Partners (SCP) was born in 2020. SCP exists to bolster the Anglican Church in raising up strong Christ-formed leaders. The church in Sudan's Nuba Mountains will be strongest if their leadership is equipped to make a long-lasting and Christ-centered impact.

SCP seeks to be faithful to this calling in a variety of ways, particularly in supporting secondary school education, forming teachers and leaders, and financing peace workshops. These reconciliation workshops among tribes, while not directly evangelistic, have at times opened new doors for the gospel.

Thus our Sudanese brothers and sisters continue to defiantly embrace the joy and calling of Christ, despite their suffering. May we be encouraged by their testimony and keep the Anglicans of the Nuba Mountains in our prayers!

Jared and his wife Abbi served in Germany from 2014-2020 as church planters and became Missionaries with SAMS. Your Society is thrilled that Jared recently answered a call to become the first Executive Director of Sudan Church Partners (SCP).

Jared first met Bishop Andudu through his work with refugees in North Carolina, and reflects, "Bishop Andudu's hard work for the Sudanese church back home and here in the diaspora was inspiring to me and drew me into a situation I knew almost nothing about. When Sudan Church Partners offered me the role of full-time Executive Director, I could hardly turn it down." Jared and Abbi continue serving with SAMS as Associate Missionaries, residing with their two young girls in North Carolina.

They are moving from Toronto to Northern Virginia, where Logan will serve as an intern at an ACNA church that has a Spanish-speaking ministry. Both Samantha and Logan, with their infant son Lewis, will be immersed in language and culture and grow in ministering together as a family. Seventeen years after the young Kenyan took a step of faith and set foot in Madagascar, the Tulear sun announced a new day – the consecration day of Victor as Assistant Bishop of the Diocese of Toliara. During the consecration service on November 9, 2025, bishops from Madagascar, Kenya, and around the world joined the hundreds of local believers who had gathered to celebrate. The nations came together in gladness and the bishops knelt alongside Victor as the Archbishop of the province offered a blessing: "May the vision of God enlighten your understanding, may God's continuing call sustain your walk with Christ, and keep you joyful."
